The calendar turns over. It's a New Year. Filled with possibility. And we believe... that with our amazing, creative God... all things are possible.

There is some familiarity, to be sure. For we've remember Januarys past; we've experienced New Year's celebrations before. We've made resolutions – broken some of them, made good progress on others.

Certainly, this year will be similar – and even predictable – in some respects. But it also holds the hope that we can break free from the bonds and strictures of the past and set out into uncharted, yet-to-be discovered territory. We can expect to attain to new heights, to grow in our faith and wisdom and progress in our purposeful living on earth. These are, without question, within the realm of possibility. With the Lord, they become certainties.

In 2024 we will begin an exciting journey at Immanuel. For those of you who have been part of our faith community for some time, you may remember embarking on a congregational cruise down God's River of Life – a full 12 years ago. Monday through Saturday we'll do some sightseeing together – from the ship. Daily Devotions will be shared in our daily communiqué, observing sights we're passing, as we journey chronologically through the Bible.



2. Young man sagging by the Store: Our member was shopping at Trader Joes and on his way out saw a young man looking very dejected with a sign asking for food. He sat next to the young man and asked him what was wrong. He answered that he had been living at the shelter and that the other day all his belongings were stolen from the shelter, including his cheap cell phone. He said he needed this in order to get around and look for a job. Our member mentioned about the food packages and that our church ILC was always trying to help people. The young man said that was very special. Before saying goodbye, our member told the young man to try to keep his spirits up and to go back to the shelter. He said he was but was trying to get some food and money to get another phone. They talked about positivity and using all the gov't services available. The young took the two bags and he thanked our member profusely.

Helping anyone even if it is just a little means so much to people who literally have nothing. God's grace.

Women's Breakfast







These hikes are planned to be fun for the whole family. We're planning to venture out the Saturday after Thanksgiving... to work off some of that turkey... ③ This will be a "no one left behind" hike. Invite your friends!

Jan. 13: Calero Reservoir: Main Entrance, 23205 McKean Rd., San Jose, CA 95120. This is an out-and-back hike, mostly flat with some moderate hills.



Getting There: Heading south on Highway 85, exit Almaden Expressway. Head south and continue on Almaden Expressway for about 5 miles (until it T's at Harry Road). Turn RIGHT. Then, in about 100 yards, turn LEFT on McKean Rd. Go 4.8 miles, and make a sharp right turn into the park. There's plenty of free parking available.

Time: 8:00 AM

Jan. 27: Santa Teresa Park: Fortini Trailhead: 22581 San Vicente Ave. San Jose, CA 95120. Moderate difficulty. A hilly, meandering loop hike.

Getting There: Driving south on Highway 85, exit Almaden Expressway. Head south, continuing on Almaden Expressway for about 4.9 miles to the end, where it "T's" at Harry Road. Turn RIGHT and go 0.1 miles to first stop sign. Turn left at McKean Rd. Proceed 1.3 miles, then turn left on Fortini Rd. and proceed to the end. Turn left. The staging area (parking) is on your right.

Plan to arrive for each hike by 7:45 AM. We'll gather our group and plan our hike. We'll hit the road at 8:00 and plan to return to our cars by 10:00.

Please RSVP so I know you'll be coming. In case of bad weather, I'll send a cancelation note to all who RSVP by 9:00 PM the evening before. 

The Broadway production of the Phantom of the Opera played to audiences for 35 years in New York with its final performance in April of 2023; a total of 13,981 performances.

Classically and theatrically trained organist, Walt Strony, has kept this production and tradition of the Phantom of the Opera alive – with a twist. Instead of a live cast on a stage, he uses remnants of the original score from the 1925 classic silent film Phantom of the Opera – playing that score on the organ. If you have never seen a production of the Phantom of the Opera – now is your chance to view this film and hear the music.



Walt Strony currently lives in Grass Valley, California. Besides being a church organist there, he has toured extensively in the U.S. presenting classical concerts, playing with symphony orchestras, and performing silent movie concerts. He has toured also in Australia, Japan, England, and Canada. In 1991 and 1993 he was awarded 'organist of the year' for theatre organs and was inducted into the American Theatre Organ Society Hall of Fame.

GOT YOUR SHOT? The latest updates on vaccine eligibility and how to schedule an appointment are available on the County's website at <u>sccfreevax.org</u>. In addition, residents without internet access or who need additional assistance can make appointments for the County Health System vaccine sites through the Valley Connection Call Center at 408-970-2000. The Call Center is open Monday

through Friday from 7 am to 9 pm and Saturday and Sunday from 8 am to 4:30 pm. Assistance is available in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and other languages. If you have trouble making your appointment and need assistance, please let Pastor Derek know. CDC Recommends Updated COVID-19 Vaccine – 09/29/2023

CDC recommends that everyone ages 6 months and older get the updated 2023–2024 COVID-19 vaccine to protect against serious illness. The updated vaccine is safe and effective at protecting against COVID-19-related hospitalization and death, and it also reduces your chance of suffering the effects of Long COVID.

Getting vaccinated is especially important for people at highest risk for severe illness, including:

- Older adults
- People who have certain health conditions
- People who have a weakened immune system
- People who are pregnant

Use <u>CDC's COVID-19 booster tool</u> to learn if and when you can get boosters to stay up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines.

CDC recommends everyone stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccination, including all primary series doses and boosters for their age group.

The original COVID shots are no longer authorized in the U.S. That's the Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 messenger-RNA vaccines based on the original strain of the SARS-CoV-2 virus that emerged in Wuhan, China, in late 2019 and were given as a two-dose primary series starting in December 2020. That strain has long been replaced by a series of variants, including the current omicron.

- One shot gets you caught up. Most people who haven't yet had a shot of the updated "bivalent" vaccine based on both the Wuhan and more recent omicron strains can now receive a single dose. That includes the 30% of Americans who didn't get vaccinated with the two-shot primary series of the original vaccine. Children 6 months to 5 years old who are unvaccinated or who had the original vaccine can receive multiple doses of the bivalent vaccine for kids.
- Older and vulnerable adults can get another booster. If you are 65 or older and already had a dose of the bivalent vaccine, you can now get a second booster of that shot after at least four months. Those with compromised immunity who had a dose of the bivalent vaccine also may receive another shot after at least two months, and additional doses at the discretion of their doctor. Most other people who already had the bivalent shot are not eligible for another.

Getting a COVID-19 vaccine after you recover from COVID-19 infection provides added protection against COVID-19. **People who are moderately or severely immunocompromised have** <u>different recommendations for COVID-19 vaccines</u>, **including boosters.** <u>Stay Up to Date with COVID-19 Vaccines Including Boosters | CDC</u>
