

Pastor Derek Writes...

"For dust you are, And to dust you shall return" Genesis 3:19

Our lives consist in contrasts. Ups & downs. Happy & sad. Exercise & rest. Travels & staying home. Fasting & feasting.

As we began our journey down *God's River of Life*, we discovered that, by God's own assessment, all of creation was "very good" (Gen. 1:31). Indeed, it was an Edenic paradise.

But how soon, everything fell apart.

We know this well. We experience it every day. We can see evidence of the goodness of creation – God's fingerprints – almost everywhere... if we take the time and have eyes to see. But we also know that things are not right with the world. We regularly experience the brokenness of creation. The outcome of this brokenness – the end of our sin – is death.

But our good and gracious God is intent on restoration and redemption. And, in fact, after the fall into sin (recorded in Genesis 3), the rest of the Bible lays out God's plan to put the pieces of His broken creation back together again. And, of course, the culmination of that plan takes place in Jesus – who offers Himself in brokenness to repair, redeem and restore all that is broken in the world. Indeed, He comes to "make all things new."

The season of Epiphany (a season of revelation, a season of growing light that shines on the identity and actions of Jesus) gives way to the season of Lent – forty days that lead up to the Final Act of redemption: the suffering, death and resurrection of our Lord.

How strange – but how appropriate! – that the beginning of Lent, which takes place on Ash Wednesday, is also Valentine's Day – when we think of love. For even as we hear the sobering (and important) words that *we are dust and shall return to dust*, we also hear words of *love, life and redemption* in the Gospel of our Lord.

Once again, we see the contrasts: death & life; sin & grace.

But notice (and this is our Hope): The end of the Story is positive. God – who began it all – is also the One who always answers our bad with His good. That's what the Gospel is all about. *Jesus gave Himself for sinners*. And we who place our hope in Him will surely not be disappointed. For God will have the Final Word – and it will be a word of life!


So when we gather this Ash Wednesday to be reminded once again that we are dust, that will not be the end of the story. For the final word to be spoken will be God's Word of grace: "the body of Christ... given for you... the blood of Christ... shed for you."

May you joyfully receive this Good News and let it inspire you in all of your days.

What a mighty and magnificent God we serve! How powerful! How tender! How gracious!

Praise be to God!

He answered that he had been living at the shelter and that the other day all his belongings were stolen from the shelter, including his cheap cell phone. He said he needed this in order to get around and look for a job. Our member mentioned about the food packages and that our church ILC was always trying to help people. The young man said that was very special. Before saying goodbye, our member told the young man to try to keep his spirits up and to go back to the shelter. He said he was but was trying to get some food and money to get another phone. They talked about positivity and using all the gov't services available. The young took the two bags and he thanked our member profusely.

Helping anyone even if it is just a little means so much to people who literally have nothing. God's grace.

Come join us as we serve those in need in practical ways. As we do so, we're living into our ILC vision of "passionately responding to the grace we've received by joyfully serving others in the name of Jesus."

Women's Breakfast





Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent – forty days (not including Sundays), leading up to Easter. We gather in the sanctuary for a somber service, remembering that "we are dust, and to dust we shall return." We will also share in the Sacrament of our Lord, and hear that His body and His blood were poured out, for us.

Feb. 25: Single Service Sunday, 10:15 AM, followed with refreshments.


Wordoku has the same rules as regular Sudoku, but uses letters instead of numbers:



Beth was sitting at an airport terminal, waiting to board a plane with several others. As Beth waited, she took out her Bible and started reading. Suddenly, she felt as if everyone around her were looking at her. She looked up but realized they were looking just over her head, in the direction right behind her.

She turned around and noticed a flight attendant pushing a wheelchair with a haggard older man sitting in it. He had tangled, long white hair that was in such a mess. His wrinkled face did not look friendly at all.

She did not know why but felt drawn to the man and thought at first that God wanted her to witness to him. Beth thought, "Oh, God, please, not now, not here." No matter what she did, she could not get the man off her mind. Suddenly, she knew what God wanted her to do. She was supposed to brush this older man's hair.

She went and knelt in front of the older man and said, "Sir, may I have the honor of brushing your hair for you?" He said, "What?" Again, a little louder, she said, "Sir, may I have the honor of brushing your hair for you?" He answered, "If you talk to me, you must speak up. I am practically deaf." So, this time, she almost yelled, "Sir, may I please have the honor of brushing your hair for you?"

Everyone was watching to see what his response would be. The older man looked at her confused and said, "Well, I guess if you really want to." She said, "I don't even have a brush, but I thought I would ask anyway." He said, "Look in the bag hanging on the back of my chair. There is a brush in there." So, she got the brush out and started brushing his hair. Beth has a little daughter with long hair, so she had lots of practice getting tangles out and knew how to be gentle with him. She worked for a long time until every tangle was out.

Just as she was finishing, she heard the old man crying, and she put her hands on his knees, kneeling in front of him again, looking directly into his eyes, and said, "Sir, do you know Jesus?" He answered, "Yes, of course I know Jesus. My bride told me she couldn't marry me unless I knew Jesus, so I learned all about Jesus and asked Him to come into my heart many years ago when I married my bride."

He continued, " I am coming home to see my wife. I have been in the hospital for a long time and had to have a special surgery in this town far from my home. My wife could not come with me because she is frail." He said, "I was so worried about how terrible my hair looked, and I didn't want her to see me look so awful. But I couldn't brush my hair by myself."

Tears rolled down his cheeks as he thanked Beth for brushing his hair. He thanked her repeatedly. She was crying, and people witnessing this started tearing up as well. As they boarded the plane, the tearyeyed flight attendant stopped her and asked, "Why did you do that?"

Right there was the opportunity to share the love of God with someone else when the door opened.

We do not always understand God's ways, but be ready. He may use us to meet the needs of someone else like he met the need of this older man, and in that moment, also calling out to a lost soul who needed to know about His love.

Feb. 10: Kennedy Ascent: 15292 Kennedy Rd., Los Gatos, CA 95032

This is and out-and-back (up-and-down) hike. After a few short hills, there's a long, level stretch. Then the incline begins – with a hill & then the mountain. How far will we get? How awesome will our view be? Come and see!

Getting There: From Highway 85, exit Los Gatos Blvd. Head south for 2 miles; then turn left on Kennedy Rd. Continue 2.3 miles to the top of Kennedy Rd. Small parking lot on the right. If full, park across the street.

Feb. 24: Sierra Azul Preserve: Woods Trail. Jacques Ridge Parking Lot. (This will be an outand-back hike, mostly level with some "rolling hills.")

Getting There: Exit Highway 85 at Camden Avenue. (From Southbound 85 turn left on Camden Avenue. From northbound 85 turn left on Branham Avenue, then left on Camden Avenue.) Travel on Camden Avenue about 1.6 miles. Travel on Hicks Road about 6.3 miles. At the stop sign (at the top of the road and the junction of Mt. Umunhum Rd., turn left. Go about 50 yards and park in the parking lot.

Plan to arrive for each hike by 7:45 AM. We'll gather our group and plan our hike. We'll hit the road at 8:00 and plan to return to our cars by 10:00.

Please RSVP so I know you'll be coming. In case of bad weather, I'll send a cancelation note to all who RSVP by 9:00 PM the evening before. 

GOT YOUR SHOT? The latest updates on vaccine eligibility and how to schedule an appointment are available on the County's website at <u>sccfreevax.org</u>. In addition, residents without internet access or who need additional assistance can make appointments for the County Health System vaccine sites through the Valley Connection Call Center at 408-970-2000. The Call Center is open Monday

through Friday from 7 am to 9 pm and Saturday and Sunday from 8 am to 4:30 pm. Assistance is available in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and other languages. If you have trouble making your appointment and need assistance, please let Pastor Derek know. CDC Recommends Updated COVID-19 Vaccine – 09/29/2023

CDC recommends that everyone ages 6 months and older get the updated 2023–2024 COVID-19 vaccine to protect against serious illness. The updated vaccine is safe and effective at protecting against COVID-19-related hospitalization and death, and it also reduces your chance of suffering the effects of Long COVID.

Getting vaccinated is especially important for people at highest risk for severe illness, including:

- Older adults
- People who have certain health conditions
- People who have a <u>weakened immune system</u>
- People who are pregnant

Read more about the updated vaccine and CDC's recommendation.

Use <u>CDC's COVID-19 booster tool</u> to learn if and when you can get boosters to stay up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines.

CDC recommends everyone stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccination, including all primary series doses and boosters for their age group.

The original COVID shots are no longer authorized in the U.S. That's the Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 messenger-RNA vaccines based on the original strain of the SARS-CoV-2 virus that emerged in Wuhan, China, in late 2019 and were given as a two-dose primary series starting in December 2020. That strain has long been replaced by a series of variants, including the current omicron.

- One shot gets you caught up. Most people who haven't yet had a shot of the updated "bivalent" vaccine based on both the Wuhan and more recent omicron strains can now receive a single dose. That includes the 30% of Americans who didn't get vaccinated with the two-shot primary series of the original vaccine. Children 6 months to 5 years old who are unvaccinated or who had the original vaccine can receive multiple doses of the bivalent vaccine for kids.
- Older and vulnerable adults can get another booster. If you are 65 or older and already had a dose of the bivalent vaccine, you can now get a second booster of that shot after at least four months. Those with compromised immunity who had a dose of the bivalent vaccine also may receive another shot after at least two months, and additional doses at the discretion of their doctor. Most other people who already had the bivalent shot are not eligible for another.

Getting a COVID-19 vaccine after you recover from COVID-19 infection provides added protection against COVID-19. **People who are moderately or severely immunocompromised have** <u>different recommendations for COVID-19 vaccines</u>, **including boosters.** <u>Stay Up to Date with COVID-19 Vaccines Including Boosters | CDC</u> 14103 Saratoga Ave. Saratoga, CA 95070
