Pastor Derek Writes...

"And the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom." Mark 15:38

I knew it immediately. As soon as I had shut the door. My mind had been otherwise occupied, and the keys I had set on the front seat of my truck were now locked inside. Inaccessible. An immediate sick feeling in the pit of my stomach. Even though I was convinced of the contrary, I nevertheless fancied that maybe there was a way to get in... I checked the driver's door again: nope, firmly closed. Then the one on the passenger side: that, too was shut tight. Next, the windows: Nope... no luck there, either. I began grasping at straws – I even entertained the illusion of turning back time. Just one do-over, please! Just one mulligan!

But there was no way in.

UGH! How could I have been SO STUPID!!!

Of course, it was no one's fault but my own. But I took it personally. I felt blamed. Punished. As if I had been confronted by the Seinfeld Soup Nazi: No soup for you!

You may be thinking I'm being melodramatic and overdoing the scene. But to lose control and to be unable to gain it back – was not a feeling I'm used to, and it made me more than a bit uncomfortable...

The temple in Jerusalem had different areas of accessibility. Non-Jews were able to get as far as the Courtyard of the Gentiles – but no further. Jews could get closer, but could not enter the holy place – that was reserved for the priests. And the Holy of Holies, where the very presence of God was made known: that was accessible only to the High Priest – and then only on the Day of Atonement.

The Holy of Holies was a sacred space, sequestered and sealed, as it were, by a veil. This veil was the one that was "rent in twain" from top to bottom – at the moment of Jesus' death.

What is Mark telling us by writing of this occurrence? In a word: Access! Entry! Welcome!

You may have never before conceived of Jesus as Lord Locksmith. But this is indeed one portrait of Jesus and the work He has accomplished.

His death and resurrection proclaim access to the presence of God. The Passion proclaims who God is and what God does. Heaven is not off-limits or inaccessible to all but the most religious saints – the holy of holies. Jesus – the Key of David – unlocks heaven's gates and welcomes all into the presence of God.


Our Lenten season continues in these next weeks and culminates in Holy Week, during which we will rehearse once more these momentous events and bow down in awe before our self-giving Lord.

You are invited to celebrate the goodness of God – and you are encouraged to extend the welcome to others – that they, too, might to come hear the Good News of this great salvation.

The man said that he could really use this and then that he and others lived under the bridge on Prospect Ave. near Lawrence and that he was also collecting food and money for them. Our member gave him two bags and he thanked him profusely and said God Bless.

2. Young man sagging by the Store: Our member was shopping at Trader Joes and on his way out saw a young man looking very dejected with a sign asking for food. He sat next to the young man and asked him what was wrong. He answered that he had been living at the shelter and that the other day all his belongings were stolen from the shelter, including his cheap cell phone. He said he needed this in order to get around and look for a job. Our member mentioned about the food packages and that our church ILC was always trying to help people. The young man said that was very special. Before saying goodbye, our member told the young man to try to keep his spirits up and to go back to the shelter. He said he was but was trying to get some food and money to get another phone. They talked about positivity and using all the gov't services available. The young took the two bags and he thanked our member profusely.

Helping anyone even if it is just a little means so much to people who literally have nothing. God's grace.

Come join us as we serve those in need in practical ways. As we do so, we're living into our ILC vision of "passionately responding to the grace we've received by joyfully serving others in the name of Jesus."

Sunday school provides a structure for teaching God's Word. Preaching isn't enough. A systematic teaching of the Scriptures – not just preaching (Acts 5:42) needs to occur through all age levels. How Easter Came to Be

"God sent his Son into the world not to judge the world, but to save the world through him." (John 3:17, NLT)


While Jesus lived on earth, he healed the sick, performed miracles, and taught

Women's Breakfast






Wordoku has the same rules as regular Sudoku, but uses letters instead of numbers:

• Each of the nine rows is nine cells wide, and must contain the 9 letters used in the puzzle. So, each letter must appear once and only once in each row.

• The same is true with the nine columns. So, each letter must appear once and only once in each column.

The third unit, the region, is a « 3×3 » square bordered by a thick line, and it must also contain the 9 letters used in the puzzle. So, each letter must appear once and only once in each « 3×3 » square.

When the grid is completed, the grey squares will reveal a nine-letter word or sentence at the center of the puzzle, between the two arrows.



- Baby blankets



GOT YOUR SHOT? The latest updates on vaccine eligibility and how to schedule an appointment are available on the County's website at <u>sccfreevax.org</u>. In addition, residents without internet access or who need additional assistance can make appointments for the County Health System vaccine sites through the Valley Connection Call Center at 408-970-2000. The Call Center is open Monday

through Friday from 7 am to 9 pm and Saturday and Sunday from 8 am to 4:30 pm. Assistance is available in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and other languages. If you have trouble making your appointment and need assistance, please let Pastor Derek know. CDC Recommends Updated COVID-19 Vaccine – 09/29/2023

CDC recommends that everyone ages 6 months and older get the updated 2023–2024 COVID-19 vaccine to protect against serious illness. The updated vaccine is safe and effective at protecting against COVID-19-related hospitalization and death, and it also reduces your chance of suffering the effects of Long COVID.

Getting vaccinated is especially important for people at highest risk for severe illness, including:

- Older adults
- People who have certain health conditions
- People who have a <u>weakened immune system</u>
- People who are pregnant

Use <u>CDC's COVID-19 booster tool</u> to learn if and when you can get boosters to stay up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines.

CDC recommends everyone stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccination, including all primary series doses and boosters for their age group.

The original COVID shots are no longer authorized in the U.S. That's the Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 messenger-RNA vaccines based on the original strain of the SARS-CoV-2 virus that emerged in Wuhan, China, in late 2019 and were given as a two-dose primary series starting in December 2020. That strain has long been replaced by a series of variants, including the current omicron.

- One shot gets you caught up. Most people who haven't yet had a shot of the updated "bivalent" vaccine based on both the Wuhan and more recent omicron strains can now receive a single dose. That includes the 30% of Americans who didn't get vaccinated with the two-shot primary series of the original vaccine. Children 6 months to 5 years old who are unvaccinated or who had the original vaccine can receive multiple doses of the bivalent vaccine for kids.
- Older and vulnerable adults can get another booster. If you are 65 or older and already had a dose of the bivalent vaccine, you can now get a second booster of that shot after at least four months. Those with compromised immunity who had a dose of the bivalent vaccine also may receive another shot after at least two months, and additional doses at the discretion of their doctor. Most other people who already had the bivalent shot are not eligible for another.

Getting a COVID-19 vaccine after you recover from COVID-19 infection provides added protection against COVID-19. **People who are moderately or severely immunocompromised have** <u>different recommendations for COVID-19 vaccines</u>, **including boosters.** <u>Stay Up to Date with COVID-19 Vaccines Including Boosters | CDC</u>
