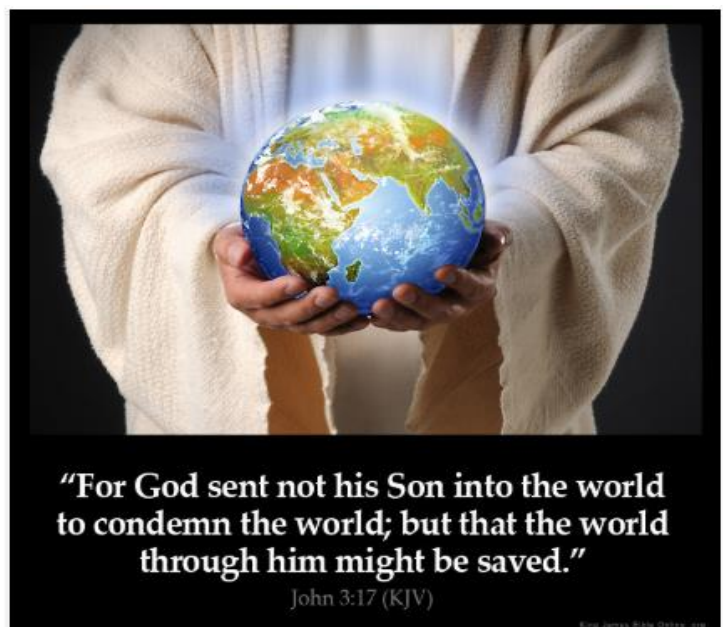

The man said that he could really use this and then that he and others lived under the bridge on Prospect Ave. near Lawrence and that he was also collecting food and money for them. Our member gave him two bags and he thanked him profusely and said God Bless.

2. Young man sagging by the Store: Our member was shopping at Trader Joes and on his way out saw a young man looking very dejected with a sign asking for food. He sat next to the young man and asked him what was wrong. He answered that he had been living at the shelter and that the other day all his belongings were stolen from the shelter, including his cheap cell phone. He said he needed this in order to get around and look for a job. Our member mentioned about the food packages and that our Church ILC was always trying to help people. The young man said that was very special. Before saying goodbye, our member told the young man to try to keep his spirits up and to go back to the shelter. He said he was but was trying to get some food and money to get another phone. They talked about positivity and using all the gov't services available. The young took the two bags and he thanked our member profusely.

Helping anyone even if it is just a little means so much to people who literally have nothing. God's grace.

Women's Breakfast

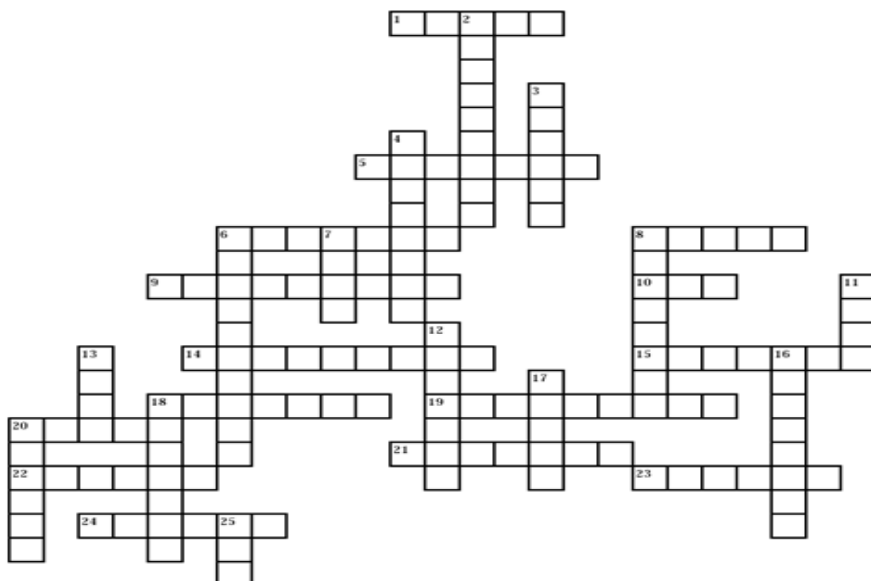

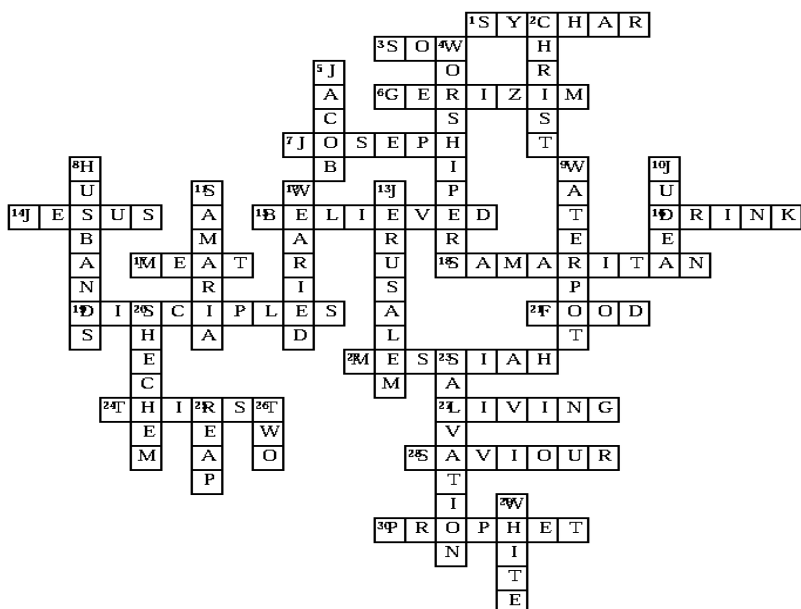

Echo, Echo...

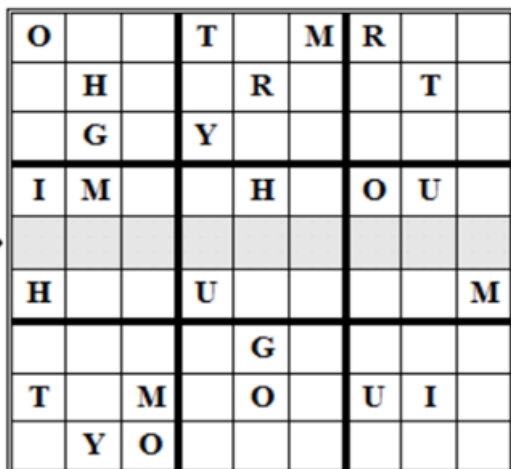

Wordoku has the same rules as regular Sudoku, but uses letters instead of numbers:

August 9: Fremont Older Open Space Preserve, Parker Ranch Trail

Getting There: From the church, turn right toward Big Basin.

At the light (Saratoga-Sunnyvale Rd.), turn right. Proceed 2.4 miles, then turn left at the light on Prospect Rd. Continue 0.4 miles to first stop sign. Turn left (to stay on Prospect Rd.) Immediately after crossing the railroad tracks, look for a place to park along the road. The trailhead is on the other side of the street.

Aug. 23: Villa Montalvo Lookout Point: An out-and-back, looped, moderate hike with just one (extended) hill. Approximately 5 miles.

Getting There: From the church, head southwest on Saratoga Ave. toward Big Basin for 0.5 miles. Turn left on Los Gatos – Saratoga Rd. In 0.4 miles, turn right on Montalvo Rd. **Park on the right-hand side of Montalvo Rd., immediately park on the right-hand side of the road, as soon as it is safe to do so.**

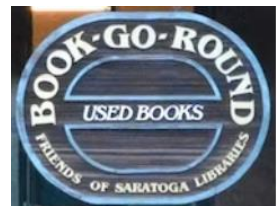
Time: 8:00 AM

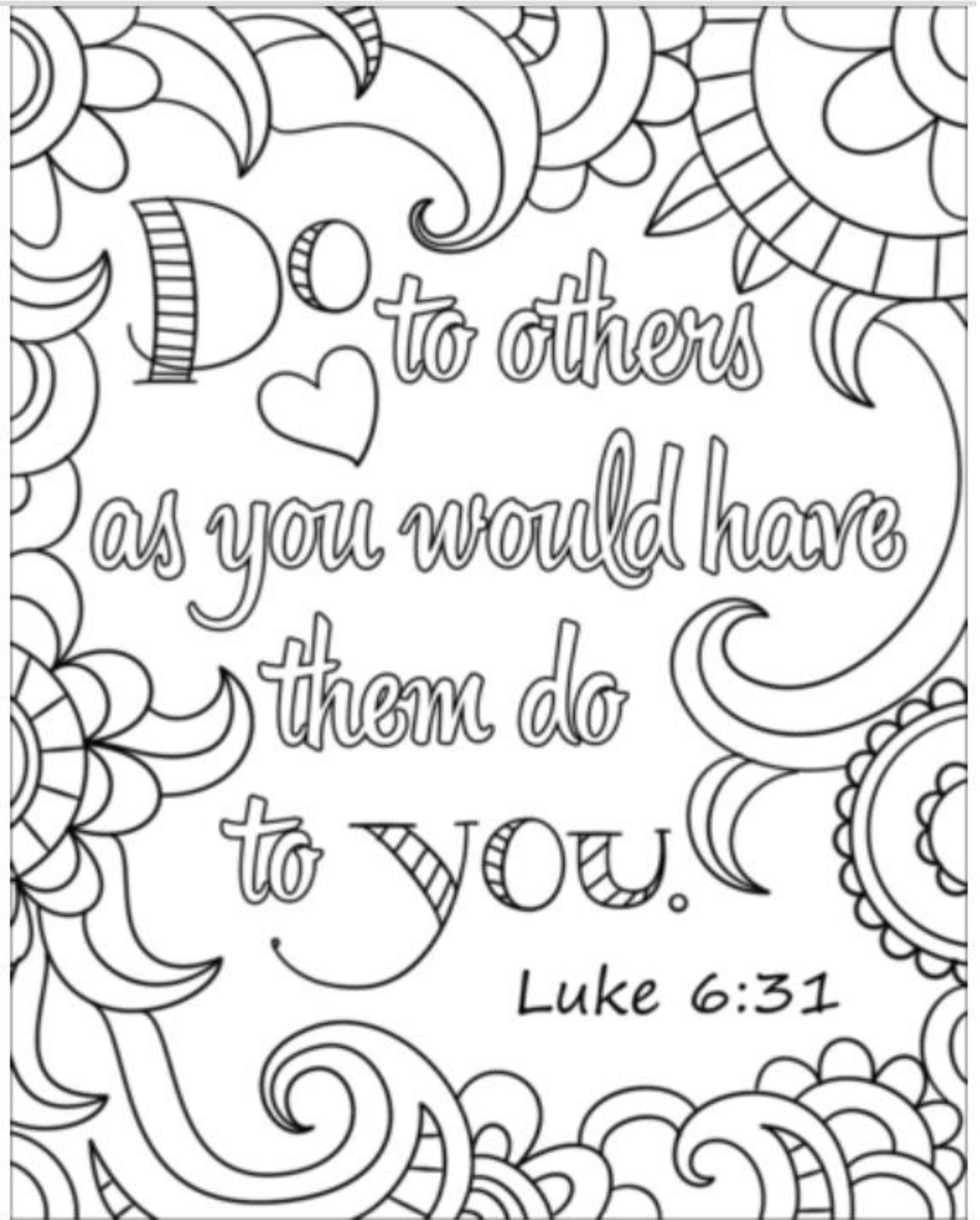


Children's Books Ministry

CDC recommends that everyone ages 6 months and older get the updated 2024–2025 COVID-19 vaccine to protect against serious illness. The updated vaccine is safe and effective at protecting against COVID-19-related hospitalization and death, and it also reduces your chance of suffering the effects of Long-term COVID.

One shot gets you caught up. Most people who haven't yet had a shot of the updated "bivalent" vaccine based on both the Wuhan and more recent omicron strains can now receive a single dose. That includes the 30% of Americans who didn't get vaccinated with the two-shot primary series of the original vaccine. Children 6 months to 5 years old who are unvaccinated or who had the original vaccine can receive multiple doses of the bivalent vaccine for kids.

Older and vulnerable adults can get another booster. If you are 65 or older and already had a dose of the bivalent vaccine, you can now get a second booster of that shot after at least four months. Those with compromised immunity who had a dose of the bivalent vaccine may also receive another shot after at least two months and additional doses at the discretion of their doctor.

Getting a COVID-19 vaccine after you recover from COVID-19 infection provides added protection against COVID-19.
