Pastor Derek Writes...

"For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for the salvation to everyone who believes..." Romans 1:16

Certainly the most *Lutheran* Sunday of the year is Reformation Sunday – coming up in a few weeks on October 26. All other Sundays of the year can be said to be shared with all other denominations (branches) of the Christian Church. Reformation Sunday, is quintessentially Lutheran.

In our day and age, *Luther* and *Lutheranism* is unfamiliar, even foreign to many. When they hear the word *Lutheran*, might not understand it as Christian. They might not realize Lutheranism is a subset of Christianity.

There is a balance, I think, between putting too much stress on our Lutheran brand and focusing so little on what makes us unique that we lose our Lutheran identity. We are Christian first, Lutheran second. Luther himself would never want Christians to follow him, but to follow Christ – first and alone. However, Luther was instrumental in preserving the gospel of which neither he (nor the apostle Paul in the verse above) was ashamed.

There is a balance, I think, between putting too much stress on our Lutheran brand and focusing so little on what makes us unique that we lose our Lutheran identity. We are Christian first, Lutheran second. Luther himself would never want Christians to follow him, but to follow Christ – first and alone. However, Luther was instrumental in preserving the gospel of which neither he (nor the apostle Paul in the verse above) was ashamed.

The gospel, as Luther came to discover it, was the free gift of salvation in Christ Jesus our Lord. Salvation came from God's initiative alone, apart from works, received through faith (which, Luther would say, was itself a gift of the Holy Spirit, working through the proclaimed promise of God). Luther was a priest in the (Roman Catholic) Church, which, at the time, was convoluting the teaching of the gospel. When Luther's eyes were opened to the freedom of the gospel, he was moved to bring to the attention of others what he was convinced were abuses to the teaching of the gospel. He wrote about the freedom of the Christian (and yet the obligation of the Christian to be a servant of all).

In 1517 in Wittenberg, Germany, Luther intended to raise points of debate in the seminary, and when his intention was discovered by bishops – and by the Pope himself – he was called to account for his writings – and asked to recant (to apologize for his errors and "take back" his words and works. He would not. Famously, in 1521, at a church conference (called a diet) in the city of Worms, before the Holy Roman Emperor Charles V, Luther declared when called upon to recant: "Here I stand. I can do no other. God help me." Luther was then excommunicated and deemed a heretic. It was never Luther's intention to leave the Church; he loved the church. However, in his commitment to preserve the gospel from error, he protested the abuses taking place within the Church he so loved. Thus, the designation of the *Protestant* movement.

Those who were in agreement with Luther, energized by his insight and followed his teachings, were deemed "Lutherans." It was, at first, a derogatory term. Later, the designation came to be a title used with pride. Christ alone. Grace alone. The Word (of God) alone. Faith alone. There were some of the major teaching points of the reformer whose name we have taken to describe our "brand."

There is another key verse in Scripture that well states the central conviction of Luther: salvation by grace through faith. Paul writes to the Galatians (2:16):

"... nevertheless, knowing that a person is not justified by works of the Law but through faith in Christ Jesus, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, so that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by works of the Law; since by works of the Law no flesh will be justified,"


As if to stress the importance of this teaching, the apostle states the same thing three times, hammering the truth home.

As Lutheran Christians, we follow Christ. And we are grateful for the insights of Luther, as much as they led us to follow Jesus.

On Reformation Sunday, we will celebrate the freedom of the gospel and express gratitude for our Lutheran heritage. It is customary to dress in red (representing the fire of the Holy Spirit, the power behind the reformation).

He said he was but was trying to get some food and money to get another phone. They talked about positivity and using all the gov't services available. The young took the two bags and he thanked our member profusely.

Helping anyone even if it is just a little means so much to people who literally have nothing. God's grace.

Women's Breakfast







A frail older man moved in with his son, daughter-in-law, and four-year-old grandson. The older man's hands trembled, his eyesight was blurred, and his step faltered.

The family ate together at the table, but the elderly grandfather's shaky hands and failing sight made eating difficult. Peas rolled off his spoon onto the floor.

When he grasped the glass, milk spilled on the tablecloth. The son and daughter-in-law became irritated with the mess.

"We must do something about Grandfather," the son said. "I've had enough of his spilled milk, noisy eating, and food on the floor." So the husband and wife set a small table in a corner.

There, Grandfather ate alone while the rest of the family enjoyed dinner. Since Grandfather had broken a dish or two, his food was served in a wooden bowl.

When the family glanced in Grandfather's direction sometimes, he had a tear in his eye as he sat alone. Still, the only words the couple had for him were sharp admonitions when he dropped a fork or spilled food.

The four-year-old watched it all in silence.

One evening before supper, the father noticed his son playing with wood scraps on the floor. He asked the child sweetly, "What are you making?" Just as sweetly, the boy responded, "Oh, I am making a little bowl for you and Mama to eat your food when I grow up." The four-year-old smiled and went back to work.

The words struck the parents so profoundly that they were speechless. Then tears started to stream down their cheeks.

Getting There: Heading south on Highway 85, exit Almaden

Expressway. Head south and continue on Almaden Expressway for about 1.2 miles. Turn RIGHT on McAbee Rd. Continue for 1.7 miles (just past Castillero School). Street parking only.

Time: 8:00 AM. Plan to arrive by 7:45 AM. We'll gather our group and plan our hike. We'll hit the road at 8:00 and plan to return to the parking lot right around 10:00.



Getting There: Exit Highway 85 at Camden Avenue. (From Southbound 85 turn left on Camden Avenue. From northbound 85 turn left on Branham Avenue, then left on Camden Avenue.) Travel on Camden Avenue about 1.6 miles. Travel on Hicks Road about 6.3 miles. At the stop sign (at the top of the road and the junction of Mt. Umunhum Rd., turn right. Continue uphill 1.7 miles. Parking lot is on the left.




there is a comfortable seating arrangement, where visitors may enjoy classical music while perusing.









