I'm excited about this coming year. Not only for the refreshment I expect to receive during my time away. I'm also excited about what God will do in the Immanuel faith community in my absence. Walking, hiking and cycling will also be part of my daily routine, as this, too, serves to keep my body healthy and refreshes my soul.

I would like to thank the congregation for granting me this time off. I look forward to sharing the results with you upon my return – even as I will look forward to hearing how God has worked in the ILC faith community while I've been away.

2. Young man sagging by the Store: Our member was shopping at Trader Joes and on his way out saw a young man looking very dejected with a sign asking for food. He sat next to the young man and asked him what was wrong. He answered that he had been living at the shelter and that the other day all his belongings were stolen from the shelter, including his cheap cell phone. He said he needed this in order to get around and look for a job. Our member mentioned about the food packages and that our Church ILC was always trying to help people. The young man said that was very special. Before saying goodbye, our member told the young man to try to keep his spirits up and to go back to the shelter. He said he was but was trying to get some food and money to get another phone. They talked about positivity and using all the gov't services available. The young took the two bags and he thanked our member profusely.

Helping anyone even if it is just a little means so much to people who literally have nothing. God's grace.

Come join us as we serve those in need in practical ways. As we do so, we're living into our ILC vision of "passionately responding to the grace we've received by joyfully serving others in the name of Jesus."

Women's Breakfast

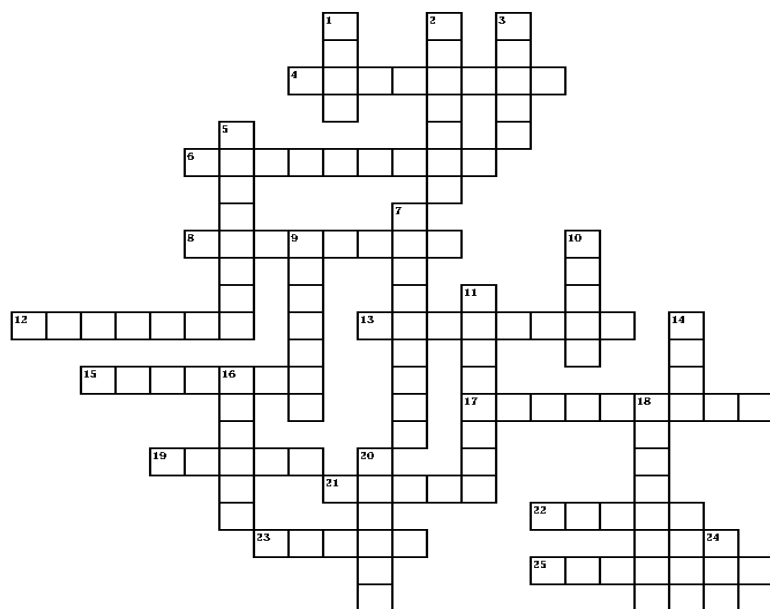

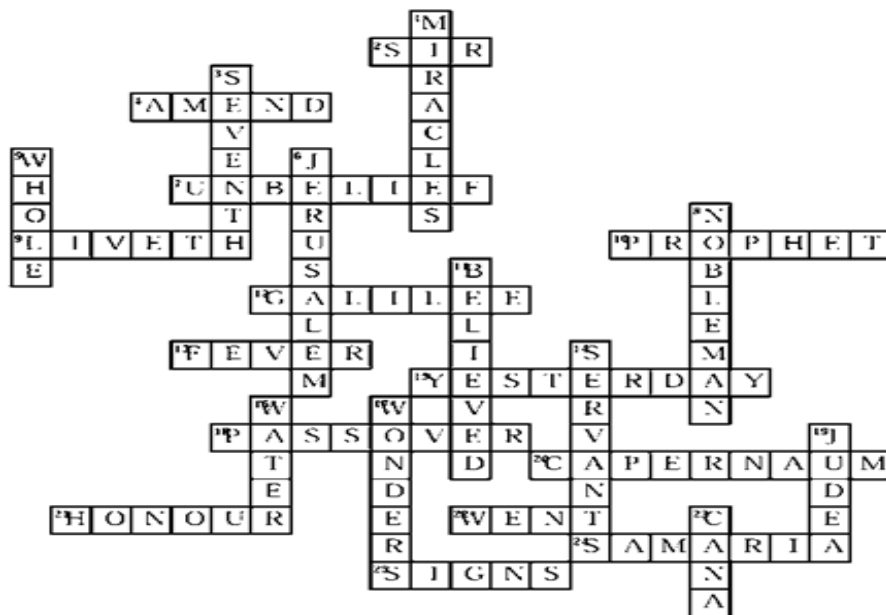

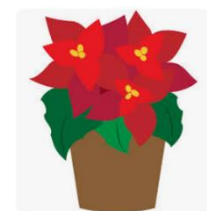

Echo, Echo...

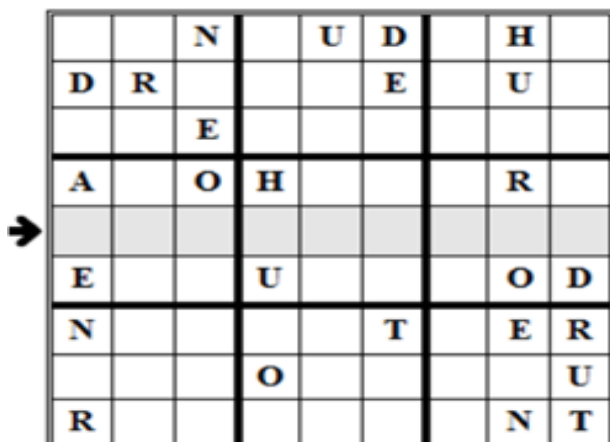

Come join us, as we explore part of the wonderful nature that surrounds our neighborhoods.

Jan. 10: Calero Reservoir: Main Entrance, 23205 McKean Rd., San Jose, CA 95120. This is a rolling hills loop hike, with some nice views.

Getting There: Heading south on Highway 85, exit Almaden Expressway. Head south and continue on Almaden Expressway for about 5 miles (until it T's at Harry Road). Turn RIGHT. Then, in about 100 yards, turn LEFT on McKean Rd. Go 4.8 miles, and make a sharp right turn into the park. There's plenty of free parking available.

Time: 8:00 AM

Jan. 24: Sierra Azul Preserve: Woods Trail (North). Jacques Ridge Parking Lot. (This will be an out-and-back hike, mostly level with some "rolling hills.")

Getting There: Exit Highway 85 at Camden Avenue. (From Southbound 85 turn left on Camden Avenue. From northbound 85 turn left on Branham Avenue, then left on Camden Avenue.) Travel on Camden Avenue about 1.6 miles. Travel on Hicks Road about 6.3 miles. At the stop sign (at the top of the road and the junction of Mt. Umunhum Rd., **turn left**. Go about 50 yards and park in the parking lot. (Hike will begin across the street (Hicks), but the parking lot on the other side can accompany more cars).

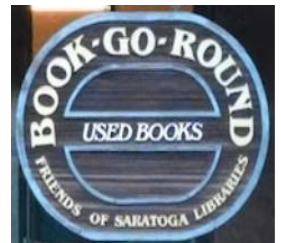
Time: Arrival: 7:45 AM; Departure: 8:00 AM

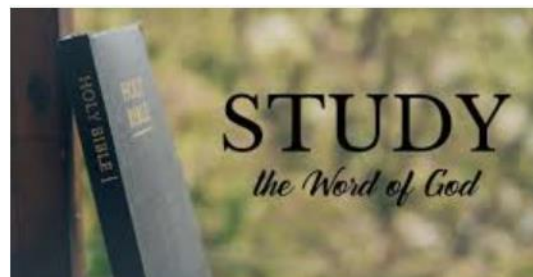
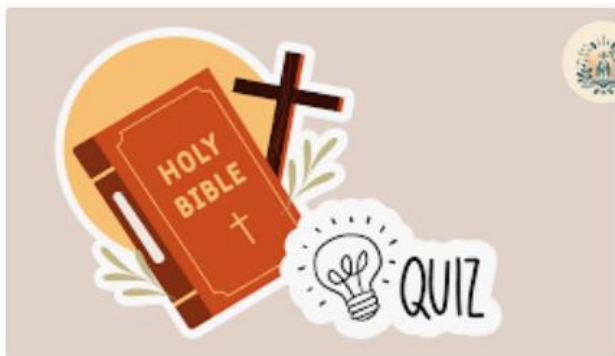

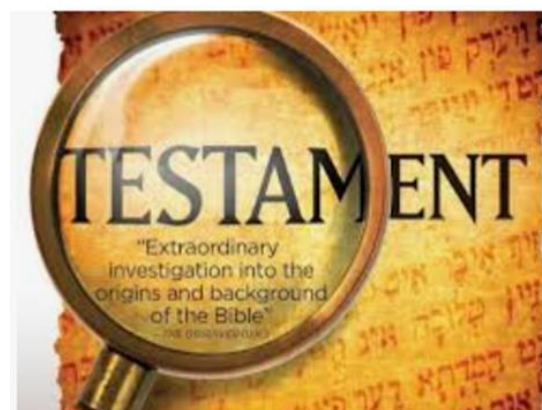
